

The Lawrence Hunger Coalition ... is a public-private partnership founded in 2010, when many churches, civic groups, public officials, and charities first met at Servants of Christ Lutheran Church and decided to partner to help our neighbors in need.

Here's How We Serve

- **FOOD:** Our four member pantries all distribute donated food. We also provide qualified households with U.S. government surplus items, day-old bakery goods, frozen meat, and/or fresh produce.
- **CLOTHING:** Two of our pantries provide kids' clothes and back-to-school kits; one location operates "Gentlemen's Closet" to provide men with clothes suitable for interviewing and getting back to work.
- **FAMILY SERVICES:** Each member pantry has its own unique outreach... One gives support directly to needy children through their school counselors... One offers GED programs for adults... Three have back-to-school programs for kids... All of us give assistance at special holidays, including Thanksgiving and Christmas...

How You Can Help...

- **Pick a Pantry:** Choose **one** member pantry to support regularly, and get to know us well... We'll gladly come to meet your group, thank you, & explain our needs...
- **Give Food:** Collect canned, boxed, & packaged food at your church, school, or office... Bring it in, or we'll come pick it up...
- **Give Clothing:** Collect children's clothes, back-to-school sets, baby items, men's work clothes (each pantry has different programs, check with your pantry's director)...
- **Give Services:** We need help with *printing...* *transporting* elderly & disabled clients... *hauling* food items from Gleaners & donors... *marketing & promotion* efforts...
- **Give Financial Help:** Each pantry is a tax-exempt charitable "501(c)3" organization; we gladly accept your financial donations to apply toward our most pressing needs...
- **Volunteer:** Volunteers keep our pantries open. Pick a morning or evening each month; meet your neighbors, it's time well spent...
- **Pick a Project:** Select **one** special way to contribute: Ask your pantry director, and we'll gladly give you great project ideas...
 - * Sponsor an **annual food drive** each year...
 - * Use your **truck/ van** to help with transport...
 - * Sponsor our **rent** for a week, a month...
 - * **Focus on a day or season:** Mother's Day, Thanksgiving, back-to-school, a birthday or anniversary or your choice...

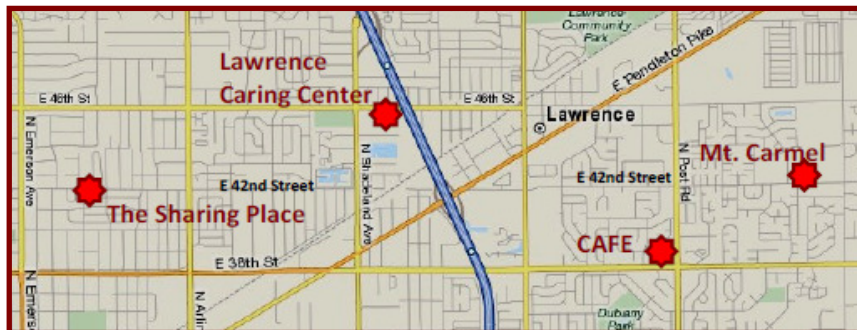
